










Save the Date – IGNITE High School Showcase

NCAP Main Round

- Families should participate in the Main Round to have the best chance to get assigned to their top school choices.
- The NCAP Main Round uses a matching process where each student receives a single best school
 offer. The matching process assigns each student to their highest-ranked school choice for which
 there is an available seat.
- The algorithm makes assignments based on student and school specific information:
 - Ranked school preferences submitted by the family
 - Student eligibility
 - Student priority
 - Available seats at each grade level
 - Student's randomly assigned lottery number
- It is critical that families make an informed and thoughtful decision about which schools to rank on the application.



26-27 Main Round Timeline



3 Nov. 2025

The 26-27 Main Round NCAP will be open from Monday, November 3rd, 2025, to Friday January 23rd, 2026.



30 Jan. 2026

Families must complete eligibility and priority verification steps by January 30th, 2026.



31 Mar. 2026

Results will be released no later than March 31st, 2026.

Main Round NCAP Closes.



23 Jan. 2026

The final deadline to cancel an application is February 25, 2026.



25 Feb. 2026

The Main Round registration deadline for all families will be April 29th, 2026.

K-12 Main Round

Families should completed an NCAP if:

- The student is entering the public school system for the first time, such as a new kindergartener
- The student is currently enrolled in a NOLA-PS school in a terminal grade (the last grade level offered) and will need to choose a new school for next year, such as 8th graders who need to apply to 9th grade
- The student would like to switch schools to a different NOLA-PS school for next school year
- The student is new to Orleans Parish and will be starting school in NOLA-PS next fall
- The student is seeking to transfer to a publicly funded seat in Orleans Parish for the next school year, such as from a private school, parochial school, or another school setting



Who Should NOT Complete an NCAP

Families should **NOT** complete the NCAP if:

- The student is happy with their current school and that school offers the next grade level. Returning students who do not apply to attend another school are guaranteed to return to their current school for the following school year.
- The student needs to be placed into a school for the current school year (not next school year).
 - Families that need placements for 25-26 should visit an FRC.



Guaranteed Seats


- In the NCAP system, students can only hold one seat at a time.
- If a student's school offers the next grade level, the student is guaranteed a spot to return to their current school for the following school year at the next grade level. Students who apply and are assigned to a different school will lose their guarantee to return to their previous school.
- Students who apply to change schools and do not receive an assignment to a ranked school will be re-assigned to the next grade level at their current school.
- Families who receive a placement at a school they choose on their NCAP will forfeit any prior school placement.



Understanding the Match Process

How are students placed?

The match software reviews the choices on each application and answers the following questions:





Schools to Verify Eligibility Criteria

Schools with eligibility criteria must confirm applicants have met eligibility criteria.

Please note that some grade levels can be open enrollment and others require applicants to meet eligibility criteria.

Understanding Priorities

COMMON ENROLLMENT PRIORITIES*

01

STUDENTS FROM CLOSING SCHOOLS

Most schools offer a priority to the students who are displaced by closing schools. 02

SIBLINGS

Most schools offer a priority to students who have a sibling that is already enrolled in that school.

03

HALF MILE

Most schools offer a priority to students who live within a half mile of that school.

04

SCHOOL ZONE

Most schools offer a priority to students who live within that school's geographic zone.

Verification steps are also included in follow up emails from NOLA-PS and are listed in the application.

Understanding Priorities

There are some priority types that apply to a small number of schools.

- **Economically Disadvantaged Priority (partial):** Applicants who qualify as economically disadvantaged based on financial need receive priority for a designated percentage of available seats. The percentage of available seats depends on the school.
- Feeder Pattern Priority (full): Applicants who attend an elementary feeder school that is linked to a high school receive priority to attend 9th grade at that school.
- Individualized Education Plan Priority (partial): In some cases, Type 2 schools are directed by the Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE) to grant priority for applicants who have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP). The percentage of those designated to receive this priority is determined by LDOE.

There are a few priority types that apply to only one school.

- French Priority (full): Applicants currently enrolled in an accredited French school or French immersion school receive priority to Audubon Uptown French program. French programs must be accredited by the Agency for French Education Abroad (AEFE).
- **Military Priority (full):** Applicants who are dependents of U.S. Military and Department of Defense personnel receive priority to New Orleans Military and Maritime Academy (NOMMA).
- Montessori Priority (full): Applicants currently attending an accredited Montessori program receive priority to Audubon Uptown Montessori School.
- UNO Staff Priority (partial): Applicants who are children of full-time University of New Orleans employees receive priority to Hynes UNO and Hynes UNO French for up to 15% of available seats.
- Tulane Affiliated (partial): Applicants who are children of full-time Tulane employees, full-time graduate students, and full-time professional students receive priority to The Willow School.



Family Link

Family link is a tool for households with multiple children applying in grades K-12. It's your way of telling us that you want all your children assigned to the same school during K-12 Main Round, even if that means they might receive a lower ranked choice. We can only try to place your children together *if you rank all their school choices* in the exact same order under one parent account. This can be done for some, or all your children, if you rank the same schools and all students you are trying to place together are eligible for the schools listed.

Some families want to have all the same school choices for all their children, but they also want each of their children to have the best chance at getting their highest ranked placement. Families in this situation should *opt* out of Family Link and understand that their students may not be assigned to the same school.

If there are different parents applying for related students, the Family Link section of the NCAP provides a number code you can enter to link related students from different households together.

K-12 Main Round Waitlists

In accordance with OPSB policy, only K-12 schools with eligibility criteria can maintain waitlists.

There are 10 schools with eligibility criteria: 4 schools with academic eligibility criteria, 5 schools with foreign language eligibility criteria, and 1 school with open house eligibility criteria. After the Main Round match, applicants who met the eligibility criteria for admission but didn't receive initial placement at the school will be placed on a waitlist. This does not include applicants who were placed at a higher ranked choice.

Waitlist information will be available in the Parent Portal shortly after the release of the Main Round results. Waitlist offers will not be extended until the start of Open Enrollment in May.

If extended an offer, families will be notified via email (and text message if they have opted into text messaging). Families will have 2 business days to accept or decline the offer before it expires.



Common NCAP Myths

MYTH #1: LISTING MORE SCHOOL CHOICES DECREASES MY CHANCES OF GETTING INTO MY TOP CHOICE.

Why is this a myth? The number of choices you list on your application does not affect the likelihood of you getting one of your top choices. We seek to place all families at their highest-ranked school when seats are available, based on family preference and each school's priorities. This way we can honor family choice, while families are not penalized for listing more options.

MYTH #2: IF I GET PLACED AT ONE OF MY MAIN ROUND APPLICATION SCHOOLS, I STILL HAVE THE CHOICE TO RETURN TO MY PREVIOUS SCHOOL.

Why is this a myth? If you are currently enrolled at a NOLA-PS school and are placed at any of the choices you list on your 2026 – 2027 application, you will lose the spot you hold at your current school. It's critical that families only apply to schools they prefer to their current school. By applying, the student is indicating that he/she would rather go to the schools where they have applied and are willing to give up their current assignment for the opportunity to do so.

MYTH #3: IF I SUBMIT MY APPLICATION EARLIER, I HAVE A GREATER CHANCE OF GETTING ONE OF MY TOP CHOICES.

Why is this a myth? All applications are processed at the same time, so there is no advantage to applying early. By processing all applications at once, families who are unable to submit their applications earlier are not at a disadvantage.



Main Round Match Dashboard

- We developed the <u>NOLA-PS Main Round Match Dashboard</u> (https://data.nolapublicschools.com/match-dashboard/) to provide families a single place to find information on eligibility criteria and priorities and understand how they impact which students are assigned where in the match.
- Families can select a school and grade level and see:
 - Eligibility requirements
 - Priorities offered, and the order in which those priorities are applied
 - How many seats were offered in the match, and how many of those seats were filled by returning students, students with priorities, and students with no priorities
